

**SYNOPSIS OF BILLS AND RESOLUTIONS
MAY 2, 2016**

The following is a brief summary of each Bill that will be considered on this evening's agenda. For detailed information, please refer to the specific Bill or Resolution:

ORDINANCES:

Bill No. 6063 – 1st Reading – Protected Margins of “No Parking” at Brentwood Court Apartments egress onto Eager Road and Oriole Lane on Eager Road – This bill is for ordinance that ensures there is protected margins of no parking, 27 feet to the east and west of the Brentwood Court Apartments egress onto Eager Road and 27 feet to the east from Oriole Lane on Eager Road; no parking from here to the corner. The Public Safety Committee made a unanimous motion that the request be forwarded to the Board of Aldermen with a positive recommendation.

Bill No. 6057 – 1st and 2nd Reading – Site Plan for Pasta Pronto – Case #16-01 South Brentwood Partners – This bill is for an ordinance repealing Ordinance No. 4704 and granting site plan approval to 2533-2539 Brentwood Blvd. (Pasta Pronto) for a new façade and related improvements which requires site plan approval pursuant to Title IV, Chapter 400 of the Brentwood Code of Ordinances. Staff inadvertently omitted the conditions of approval from the ordinance considered by the Board of Aldermen at the March 7th meeting. At its February 2016 meeting, the Planning & Zoning Commission passed a motion by a vote of 8-0, recommending the Board of Aldermen approve the Architectural Elevations and Site Plan for 2533 Brentwood Boulevard with the following conditions:

1. Include two planters (urns) in the center of the primary façade as approved by Staff.
2. Install wall sconces in the center of the primary façade as approved by Staff.
3. Install a planter at the unused curb-cut as approved by the Planning Director.

Bill No. 6061 – 1st and 2nd Reading – Amendment to the Brentwood Municipal Code regarding prohibited conduct for licenses – This bill is for an ordinance amending section 600.200 of the City of Brentwood City Code relating to prohibited conduct for licensees authorized to dispense alcoholic beverages. This bill underscores the importance of all licenses maintaining strict adherence to such standards at all times and enable the Police Department to use the regulatory authority vested in them by state law and the ordinance of the City to assure that all licenses premises are operated in a safe and lawful manner. The Public Safety Committee made a unanimous motion that the request be forwarded to the Board of Aldermen with a positive recommendation.

RESOLUTIONS:
