Dear Residents,

The kids are back in school and the days are getting shorter, it must be Fall! There is a lot going on so I will get right to it.

First, I want to thank everyone who came out for the Dancing in the Street party in August. I thought the Parks and Recreation Department did an excellent job and the music was choice! It was a well-deserved finale to our Brentwood Boulevard saga.

I would also like to thank everyone who came out for Brentwood's Annual Maddenfest the weekend of September 16th & 17th. My children call this the "funniest weekend of the year" and they might be right! The two day festival featured a variety of activities, booths, musical entertainment, rides, and of course the parade and fireworks display on Saturday. Thank you again for coming out and making this weekend a huge success!

Enforcement Actions. One of the things I heard most when I was campaigning was dissatisfaction with the enforcement of our public health and safety codes. Abandoned and improperly maintained structures and property pose health and safety risks to our neighborhoods. In addition, they negatively impact property values and generally make a poor impression. For some time now, the City has been making an effort to enforce our public health and safety codes more consistently. You may have noticed one or more properties in your neighborhood that have been the subject of these efforts. You may even have been notified of a violation. I understand it can be disconcerting to receive a **NOTICE OF VIOLATION** from the City, but I want to make it perfectly clear that the goal of all of the City's enforcement efforts is **VOLUNTARY** compliance.

Our goal is to work with property owners to bring properties into compliance with our codes. We understand that sometimes this takes time and we will work with you. It is important to note: this does not mean we will stop pursuing enforcement action, until the property is in compliance.

This approach is necessary because in some cases, a property owner will promise to bring a property into compliance, but fail to follow through once the enforcement action has ceased. This puts the City in the unfortunate position of having to start the enforcement process over; a very time consuming process. Simultaneously pursuing voluntary compliance and enforcement action allows the City to work with property owners and be in a position to take action in the event they are unwilling or unable to bring their property into compliance voluntarily. Consistent enforcement of our public health and safety codes benefits everyone and I think we are beginning to see the benefits in our neighborhoods. If you have any questions or concerns about our enforcement efforts, please contact City Administrator Bola Akande or Director of Planning and Development, Lisa Koerkenmeier.

Workshops and Comprehensive Plan. We have begun work on our comprehensive plan. This is the first update to the comprehensive plan in almost ten years! This gives us an opportunity to imagine what our City can be and develop a workable strategy for making it happen. In the next several months you will have the opportunity to get involved in this process and contribute your vision of a better Brentwood. Redevelopment, flooding, parks, walkability, in-fill housing, the Library and our trail system. These are just some of the many topics that will be addressed in the development of the comprehensive plan. I cannot encourage you strongly enough to get involved! One of your first chances will be at the Brentwood Community Workshop the evening of **Thursday, October 13, 2016** at the Recreation Center. The City's planning consultants, Houseal Lavigne Associates will conduct the workshop and everyone is welcome. If you cannot attend the Community Workshop and you still want to be involved, all you need to do is contact Director of Planning and Development, Lisa Koerkenmeier. She will be happy to give you more information.

In connection with the development of the comprehensive plan, the Board of Aldermen had a workshop session in August focused on longer term plans for the City. The goal of the workshop session was to identify areas of consensus on the Board as to what our longer term priorities should be. I think the workshop went well. There was excellent discussion of longer term plans for the Manchester Road corridor, Brentwood Blvd and City Hall. If the Board is willing, I plan to call another workshop session later this fall to revisit this discussion. My hope is that we will identify one or two priorities for the City that we can work more effectively into the comprehensive plan. These are big and complicated topics, but as they say, "the longest journey starts with a single step". I believe we have tremendous opportunities to improve our City and look forward to working with the Board to make the most of them.

Public Safety. We continue to have our share of car break-ins and thefts. Nearly all of these have been from unlocked vehicles. I know this is frustrating and makes us feel as if the bad guys are out there watching and waiting for us to make a mistake and leave our car unlocked. Unfortunately, in a way this is true. The more mistakes we make, the more success they have and the more they come around looking for another mistake. Here is what you can do to help: 1) Call 911 if you see ANYTHING suspicious; 2) Turn on your porch lights and any other outdoor lighting you have, replace the bulbs with high output LEDs and leave them on whenever it is dark; 3) Remove all valuables from your car including purses, credit cards, cell phones, golf clubs, laptops and any other valuable items; 4) Do not leave firearms in your car; 5) LOCK YOUR CAR and REMOVE THE KEYS. As I have said before, we must all work together to make Brentwood a "hard target" for the bad guys and when we do, they will spend less time here.

Voting. There is a general election on **Tuesday, November 8, 2016**. You have an opportunity to do something that more than half of the world's population does not; participate directly in the selection of your government. Too many of us take this privilege for granted and still more do not exercise it at all! If you are not registered to vote, NOW IS THE TIME! Don't put it off. Veteran's Day. The City will host a Veteran's Day ceremony at 6:30 p.m. on Friday, November 11, 2016 at the Recreation Center to honor the brave men and women who have fought to preserve our freedom (including our precious right to vote, see above). 2017 Annual Budget Planning - It's that time of year once again. We are well into the 2017 Annual Budget process as it started on July 1st - with the Board of Aldermen who gave direction in formulating the budget. In August, at the Ways and Means Committee meeting, the City Administrator had preliminary budget discussions to set parameters and goals that assisted in the development of the budget. In addition, - fund balance actuals for 2015, estimated for 2016 and projections for 2017 were presented for all funds (General Fund, Capital Improvement Fund, Storm Water and Recreation Fund and Sewer Lateral Improvement Fund). Also at this meeting a - Citizen Budget Forum was held that provided staff with additional information used to develop the goals and priorities for this year's Budget. In September, the department heads prepared their departmental and capital budgets and submitted them to the City Administrator. In addition, the Board of Aldermen held a public hearing and adopted by ordinance the 2016 property tax rates that must be submitted to St. Louis County by October 1st. In October the City Administrator and Finance Director will meet with department heads to review budget submittals and put together the proposed budget document that is presented to the Ways and Means Committee at their October meeting. It continues to be the goal of the City to present a proposed budget that will reflect a balanced budget for all funds and will provide city reserve levels comparable to policy requirements and 2016 year end budget projections. The Ways and Means Committee may have multiple meetings to discuss the proposed budget and must ultimately forward a final recommended budget to the Board of Aldermen for adoption. The Board of Aldermen must hold a public hearing and adopt the 2017 Annual Budget by ordinance.



From the Police Chief - In the last several months, the Brentwood community, and many of our neighboring cities, have experienced a rash of car break-in's. It's usually the same scenario. Sometime overnight, usually after midnight, a group of teens will enter a neighborhood and look for unlocked vehicles. They are looking for valuables in the car. If they find keys; they take the vehicle.

We have made several arrests in the last few months. When interviewing these suspects, they tell us they keep coming back to our neighborhoods because we leave our cars unlocked and we leave "good stuff" in our cars.

Our department has increased patrols in the neighborhoods. We have added staffing during the overnight times. We have spent countless hours investigating these crimes. We need your help. Lock your cars. Bring your keys and valuables inside. Close your garage doors. Light up your property. **Most important, when you see or hear something suspicious, call the police right away.** Several of the arrests we have made are the result of these calls from residents. We all need to work together to solve this problem.

Magic Bus Transportation Service - Brentwood residents with a disability or 60 years and older may use this free transportation service to reach destinations within the City of Brentwood and surrounding communities. All riders must be able to get to and from the vehicle under their own ability.

In late 2015, the City of Brentwood purchased a new Magic Bus vehicle. This vehicle holds 12 passengers, with additional space for 2 wheelchairs. The new bus also boasts a wider center aisle, a more accessible entrance/exit, improved passenger and driver visibility, better temperature control, and a smoother ride.

Candidate Filing Notice

- The City of Brentwood will hold a General Municipal Election on Tuesday, April 4, 2017 for the offices of Mayor, Municipal Judge and the office of Alderman (one from Wards 1, 2, 3, 4) each elected for **2 year terms**.

Filing for said offices shall open at 8:00 a.m. and close at 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, December 13, 2016, at which time Declarations of Candidacy shall be received in the Office of the City Clerk, at 2348 S. Brentwood Blvd, Brentwood, Missouri. Thereafter, declarations will be received during normal business hours Monday thru Friday, (excluding holidays when City Hall is officially closed) until filing closes at 5:00 p.m., Tuesday, January 17, 2017.

Candidates are required to bring a photo ID and will be assessed \$5 filing fee.

Metropolitan St. Louis Sewer District Sanitary Relief Project Taking Shape

- The Metropolitan St. Louis Sewer District has initiated a sanitary relief project to improve water quality and alleviate wastewater concerns in the Deer Creek Watershed area. Currently there are 45 locations where sanitary sewage overflows into Deer Creek during wet weather events. This sewer project will be larger than the existing sewers and will provide sufficient capacity to reduce the frequency and magnitude of sanitary sewer overflows. The project extends from Mary Avenue to Brentwood Park and includes installation of approximately 5,000 feet of 72 inch diameter sewer, 27 manholes, and 8 concrete chambers. The current project in Brentwood is the first of several phases of this relief sewer project. Future phases will extend the sewer into Rock Hill and Ladue. The Metropolitan St. Louis Sewer District hired J.H. Berra Construction Co. to complete the construction which began in late April.

Over that last couple of months, residents that live within approximately 1000 feet of the new sewer have been contacted by ABNA Engineering, a subcontractor to J. H. Berra Construction Co. requesting permission to conduct a structure condition survey. The purpose for this survey is to document the current condition of the structure. If a resident considers that damage may have occurred to their property as a result of the sewer construction project, then the condition of their property would be compared to the structure condition survey to verify that the damage occurred.

The current project schedule indicates that sewer installation work will continue along Suburban Tracks Street through the fall of 2016. Work along Russell Avenue will continue through the end of 2017. Only one lane of Russell Avenue will be closed to traffic at any time. Temporary pavement will be installed as each block of Russell is reopened to traffic. Upon completion of all sewer installation work on Russell Avenue, the entire length of Russell Avenue will be repaved. The Home Improvement Program (HIP)

- The Home Improvement Program (HIP) is a federally funded program, which provides technical advice and financial assistance to qualified homeowners for a variety of home repairs. Some funds are available to Brentwood residents. Improvements are limited to \$5,000 per residence at no cost to the homeowner. Homeowners who are interested must meet certain income and eligibility guidelines, reside in the home, and current on their real estate taxes. The program is administered by St. Louis County's Department of Planning, Office of Community Development.



City Code Enforcement to begin Vacant Residential Property Registration Program

- The Board of Aldermen recently adopted an ordinance to establish a Vacant Residential Property Registration program. The registration program will assist the City in keeping a list of residential properties with an established vacancy period of 6 months or more **and** exhibiting housing code violations. Once the property is placed on the register, a notice will be sent to the owner's last known address. The notice will provide a description of the housing code violations found on the property and that a semi-annual registration fee may be levied on the property.

The City is proposing that a \$200 semi-annual registration fee be applied to a property once it is placed on the registration list. Brentwood residents will vote on the \$200 registration fee on the November ballot. Prior to the November election, the City will implement the program and may impose a minimum registration fee that merely covers the City's actual administrative costs in registering and monitoring the property. If the \$200 registration fee is approved by voters, the Board may set that amount as the semi-annual registration fee.

Upon receiving notice from the City, the owner or agent is given thirty (30) days to complete any improvements to the property that may be necessary to remove the property from the registration. Following completion of the improvement, the owner may request a re-inspection of the property and reconsideration of the levy of the registration fee. The City anticipates that most code violations will be cured and the property will be removed from the registration. This program is considered another tool to encourage property owners to remain compliant with the City's housing and building code requirements. Brentwood continues to strive for voluntary compliance in remediating all types of code violations. 
