### Breaking Ground on Brentwood Bound: Deer Creek Greenway Connector

The City of Brentwood and its partner Great Rivers Greenway officially broke ground on the Deer Creek Greenway Connector on Thursday, April 28.

When complete, the Deer Creek Greenway Connector will create a paved, accessible walking and biking trail linking Brentwood's Memorial Park (with sidewalk access to Brentwood Promenade and Brentwood Pointe shopping centers) to Lorraine Davis Park, Barnickel Park and Deer Creek Park in Webster Groves, Deer Creek Park in Maplewood and the Deer Creek Shopping Center at Big Bend Boulevard.

The Deer Creek Greenway Connector will also link to multiple parks and amenities within Brentwood.

**Manchester Road Closure**  
**May - August 2022**

### Manchester Road Closure: Through August 2022

Black Creek Bridge on Manchester Road (just west of the intersection with Hanley Road) closed on May 2 and will remain fully closed through August 2022.

This closure will prevent traffic from going west from Hanley Road to Manchester Road. The closure also will prevent traffic from going east on Manchester Road to Hanley Road.

Throughout the closure, vehicles will still be able to access businesses and residences along the Manchester Road corridor from Brentwood Boulevard.

During the same time, work will take place on the pedestrian tunnel near Mary Avenue. This work will reduce Manchester Road traffic to one lane in each travel direction.




Progress continues on the three components of the Brentwood Bound Plan. These transformative initiatives are bound together in building a bright future for Brentwood.

# Deer Creek Greenway Connector

## Construction Timeline: 9/2021 - Fall/Winter 2023

Trail connection from Rogers Parkway, north of Manchester Road to the Deer Creek Greenway

- Trailhead with parking
- Additional parking for the new Brentwood Park
- Greenway linking multiple parks
- .65 mile long paved trail
- Potential to connect more than 28 miles of greenways
- In conjunction with other components of the plan there is potential for a 3K and 5K race route.

The Brentwood Bound plan includes the potential for new trails, a 3K and 5K route, parks and greenspaces throughout the revitalized area.



### CITY SERVICES

#### CodeRED/OnSolve Emergency Notification + Weather Warning Alerts

Sign up to receive notifications of impending emergencies, weather alerts, or critical community alerts via phone, email or text. Click the CodeRED button on the home page of [brentwoodmo.org](http://brentwoodmo.org) or call 314.963.6710 to sign up. Download the **CodeRED Mobile Alert by Onsolve LLC** mobile app for real-time, location-specific alerts.

Brentwood's CodeRED Community Notification System includes CodeRED Weather Warning, which provides residents and businesses with automated severe weather alerts. Those who choose to opt in to this service will receive flash flood, tornado and severe thunderstorm warnings just moments after an alert has been issued by the National Weather Service.

The City of Brentwood sends other public safety notifications, such as road closures or specific emergency situations, through the CodeRED system. The City of Brentwood CodeRED Assistance Line is 314.963.6710. Please leave your name and phone number, and a staff member will return your call as soon as possible.

**There is no charge to residents or businesses for this service.**

#### Knox HomeBox Loan Program

The Brentwood Fire Department offers a 90-day Knox HomeBox loan program for residents who have a temporary special need or physical disability preventing them from opening their front door to Brentwood fire and medical personnel in event of an emergency. Call 314.963.8612.

#### MAGIC Bus

This free service is designed to transport Brentwood residents age 60 and older or adults with disabilities to destinations within Brentwood and surrounding communities. To learn more, call 314.963.8685.

#### Medication Disposal

Deposit acceptable items directly into the medication disposal drop box located inside the Brentwood Police Department lobby, 8 am to 4 pm, Monday through Friday.

#### Notary

### Report a Concern, Make a Request

Make requests (such as vacation checks or household item pick-ups) or submit concerns through the MyGov request-tracking system via the home page of [brentwoodmo.org](http://brentwoodmo.org). Click on the "Report a Concern" button, choose a category and submit your request. You'll receive feedback when the request is received and also will receive updates as the request is investigated by City staff.

### Reminders to Homeowners

Brentwood homeowners are responsible for mowing and maintaining the area between the street and the sidewalk along their property. Overhanging brush, overhanging tree limbs and high weeds need to be cut back to ensure a clear and safe passage along the sidewalk, per Municipal Code sections 505.070 and 505.090.

Brentwood's Municipal Code also prohibits short-term rentals.

### Summer Safety Tips from Brentwood Fire Department

Summer is a great time to:

**Check your smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors.** Make sure they are working properly. Replace old batteries.

There should be at least one smoke detector for each level of the home. There should be one smoke detector in every bedroom as well as one in each bedroom hallway.

If your home has fuel-burning appliances (gas stove or furnace), there should be at least one carbon monoxide detector present, located in the bedroom hallway.

**Review and practice escape plans with your family.** Have a designated meeting place outside of your home should you need it.

**Be safe with barbecue grills and fire pits.** The Brentwood Fire Department follows St. Louis County's ordinances regarding recreational backyard fires. You must have the fire contained within a fire ring and be away from area structures, be present while the fire burns, have an extinguishing source nearby, and burn wood or similar combustibles (not trash). **Barbecue grills and fire pits are not allowed on balconies of condos or apartments.**

Please contact the Brentwood Fire Department to request help with installation of smoke detectors or carbon monoxide detectors or with questions about any fire safety issues.

## Brentwood Police Host Community Meeting

The Brentwood Police Department hosted a community meeting on June 11 at Broughton Park. Officers shared updates about police work in the neighborhood related to Manchester Road construction. Residents had the opportunity to discuss concerns about traffic and other issues.

## Brentwood Receives \$300,000 Grant for Wetland Project


## Brentwood Days 2022: September 16 & 17
