Lithium-Ion Battery Safety Tips from Brentwood Fire Department



Lithium-ion batteries are used in various devices, most commonly in cell phones, laptops, tablets, electric cars, and scooters. Lithium-ion batteries store a large amount of energy and can pose a threat if not treated properly. Like any product, a small number of these batteries are defective. They can overheat, catch fire or even explode.

Follow these guidelines when using any devices powered by lithium-ion batteries:

- When purchasing devices, be sure that the equipment has the Underwriters Laboratories mark. The UL mark shows that the product has been safety tested.
- Follow the manufacturer's instructions for charging and storage.
- Do not charge a device under your pillow, on your bed or on a couch.
- Always use the manufacturer's cord and power adapter made specifically for the device.
- Keep batteries/devices at room temperature. Do not place in direct sunlight.
- Store batteries away from anything flammable.
- If a battery overheats or you notice an odor, change in shape/color, leaking, or odd noises from a device, discontinue use immediately. If safe to do so, move the device away from anything that can catch fire and call 9-1-1.

Battery Disposal:

- Putting lithium-ion batteries in the trash or recycling at home is illegal.
- Recycle batteries by taking them to a battery recycling location or visiting <http://call2recycle.org> for disposal instructions.
- Individually bag batteries or tape ends before disposing of them.
- If battery is damaged, place the battery or device in a non-flammable material such as sand or kitty litter as soon as possible and move damaged battery to safe location, away from buildings and others; rapid, intense fire could occur.

Safety and Awareness Tips from Brentwood Police Department

If you're ever in a dangerous situation, call 9-1-1 immediately.

- Walk with a purpose and stay off your phone. Be aware of your surroundings.
- If you are shopping alone and feel uncomfortable about walking to your car, ask store security to escort you to your vehicle.
- When walking to your vehicle, have your keys in your hand, scan the interior of your vehicle before entering, and lock your doors immediately.
- Avoid carrying a large purse, and if you do, keep it close to your body. Should someone grab your purse, do not resist; your safety is worth more than the replaceable items in the purse.
- Avoid contact with strangers. A common theme is to be distracted away from your purse so someone else can steal your wallet.
- While dining, be careful where you hang your purse, as others maybe able to remove your wallet.
- In your vehicle, stay off your phone. Have a plan for where you park. Park in well-lit areas around other vehicles.
- Avoid warming your car. Thieves are opportunistic. Lock your vehicle, and always take your keys/fob with you.
- Do not leave valuables and packages in open view inside your vehicle. This is a personal invite for strangers to break in.
- When pumping gas, lock your car doors. Thieves have been known to enter your car and steal items while you're pumping gas.







Christmas Tree Recycling – Wednesdays in January: Brentwood Public Works will pick up and recycle live Christmas trees. Please remove all lights and ornaments before placing tree by the curb. The last possible collection date will be February 1, 2023, if inclement weather causes delays in January.

CITY SERVICES

CodeRED/OnSolve Emergency Notification + Weather Warning Alerts

Sign up to receive notifications of impending emergencies, weather alerts, or critical community alerts via phone, email or text. Click the CodeRED button on the home page of brentwoodmo.org or call 314.963.6710 to sign up. Download the **CodeRED Mobile Alert by Onsolve LLC** mobile app for real-time, location-specific alerts.

Brentwood's CodeRED Community Notification System includes CodeRED Weather Warning, which provides residents and businesses with automated severe weather alerts. Those who choose to opt in to this service will receive flash flood, tornado and severe thunderstorm warnings just moments after an alert has been issued by the National Weather Service.

The City of Brentwood sends other public safety notifications, such as road closures or specific emergency situations, through the CodeRED system. The City of Brentwood CodeRED Assistance Line is 314.963.6710. Please leave your name and phone number, and a staff member will return your call as soon as possible.

There is no charge to residents or businesses for this service.

Knox HomeBox Loan Program

The Brentwood Fire Department offers a 90-day Knox HomeBox loan program for residents who have a temporary special need or physical disability preventing them from opening their front door to Brentwood fire and medical personnel in event of an emergency. Call 314.963.8612.

MAGIC Bus

This free service is designed to transport Brentwood residents age 60 and older or adults with disabilities to destinations within Brentwood and surrounding communities. To learn more, call 314.963.8685.

Medication Disposal


Deposit acceptable items directly into the medication disposal drop box located inside the Brentwood Police Department lobby, 8 am to 4 pm, Monday through Friday.


Click on the “Report a Concern” button, choose a category and topic, complete the information, and submit your request.


